

Using Surface Currents (and Winds) to Sail Around the World

Use the surface current map to plan how you would use currents to sail around the world. Start in La Conner and list all of the currents you would try to use in order to get around the world and back to La Conner.

1. Get a blank piece of paper and list those currents, in order.
2. Get a blank piece of paper and draw a cross section of a boat that you would use to make that journey. Draw all of the supplies and rooms you might need. It would take about a year if done right.
3. Make an imaginary journal of the countries you might stop at while making the trip. Use Culturegrams to find countries and photos of places on the way. Draw a picture and make a journal entry for each of the places where you stop.
