Hello families,

We've done it! Our transition to hybrid learning is complete for about 75% of our students. It's been exciting to have students back in the building in every grade. We've also successfully transitioned our remote learners into their new virtual classrooms, thanks to our new team of amazing remote teachers. The support we, the school, have felt from you, our families, has been fantastic. Thank you for working with us as a team through it all.

Our March calendar is complicated, so allow me to clarify what school will look like in the next few weeks.

- March 4-5 (this week) – **No school**, Mid-Winter Break
- March 16-19 – **half days** of school for end of Trimester 2 and Parent-Teacher Conferences
 - **Monday, March 15, is a full day**; both AM and PM Cohorts will attend school

After conferences, we'll have two full weeks of school, and then it's **Spring Break, April 5-9!** The year is speeding by.
