Find amazing new features by clicking on the link above this logo, on the Food Services page of our website.

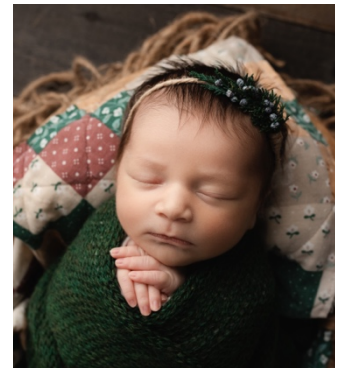
